B&H is placed in the **heart** of Europe with a mixture of Mediterranean and continental climates (cold Winters and hot Summers).




DO YOU KNOW WHY SARAJEVO IS CALLED





Confirmation of arrival

Confirmation of arrival is a document stating your status at the University of Sarajevo, namely the starting and ending date of your mobility.

It must be sent to your home university to your home coordinators (scanned by email) upon arrival or the official start of activities.

Admission


Enrolment (or admission) is required to follow courses freely, research, participate in-group studies and take exams.

Registration puts you into the university system, making it possible to prepare your transcript of records before you depart.

To register, you need to purchase the required admission documents:

- 1. Identification document (index)
- 2.Admission papers

Regulating your status

Entry of international students and staff members to Bosnia and Herzegovina is regulated by instructions and regulations of the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

As in every country in the world, Bosnia and Herzegovina has its own regulations when it come to foreign entering and exiting. As an exchange student/staff who will stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina longer than 90 days for academic/teaching purposes, you will need to regulate your residence permit. This is done in two steps:

- 1 White card
- 2 Residence permit

LANGUAGE SCHOOL

- It is organized based on the interest of international students

- No fee for students
- Receives 2 ECTS

Scan the code and enter a specialized UNSA's Google map with recommendations of places to visit, food and drinks to try, and activities to do during your stay in Sarajevo!
























DURING

MOBILITY

- We expect you to spend your mobility at UNSA (meaning: don't miss classes, tutorials, research, and other academic activities that are part of your mobility program).
- Be in contact with your **host coordinators** (changes, questions about modules, exams, dates).
- Be in contact with your home coordinators, especially if changes are needed regarding your mobility.
- Stay safe!

DURING

- Any changes in your activities (subjects, ECTS, classes, timetable, permissions, etc.) should be discussed with the academic coordinator at the UNIT you are performing your mobility.

BEFORE

DEPARTING

- Before departing, contact your host coordinator and our office to confirm the end of your mobility (and sign a confirmation of departure).
- The student who followed classes and took exams will receive a **transcript of records** with their results (after submitting the index to the student services).
- For students who did not take exams, but did research for their final work, a specialized form needs to be filled in (**Final report**) about student activities and research and signed by appointed coordinators (all explained in the Final report template).
